Campground Beach Access

Accessing the beach from the campground is easy: start on the 700-foot-long boardwalk that winds through the wetlands to a primitive lake access. From there, follow a short gravel trail to a sidewalk along Highway 101, then take the crosswalk to safely access the beach at D River State Recreation Site.

Boating and Other Water Sports

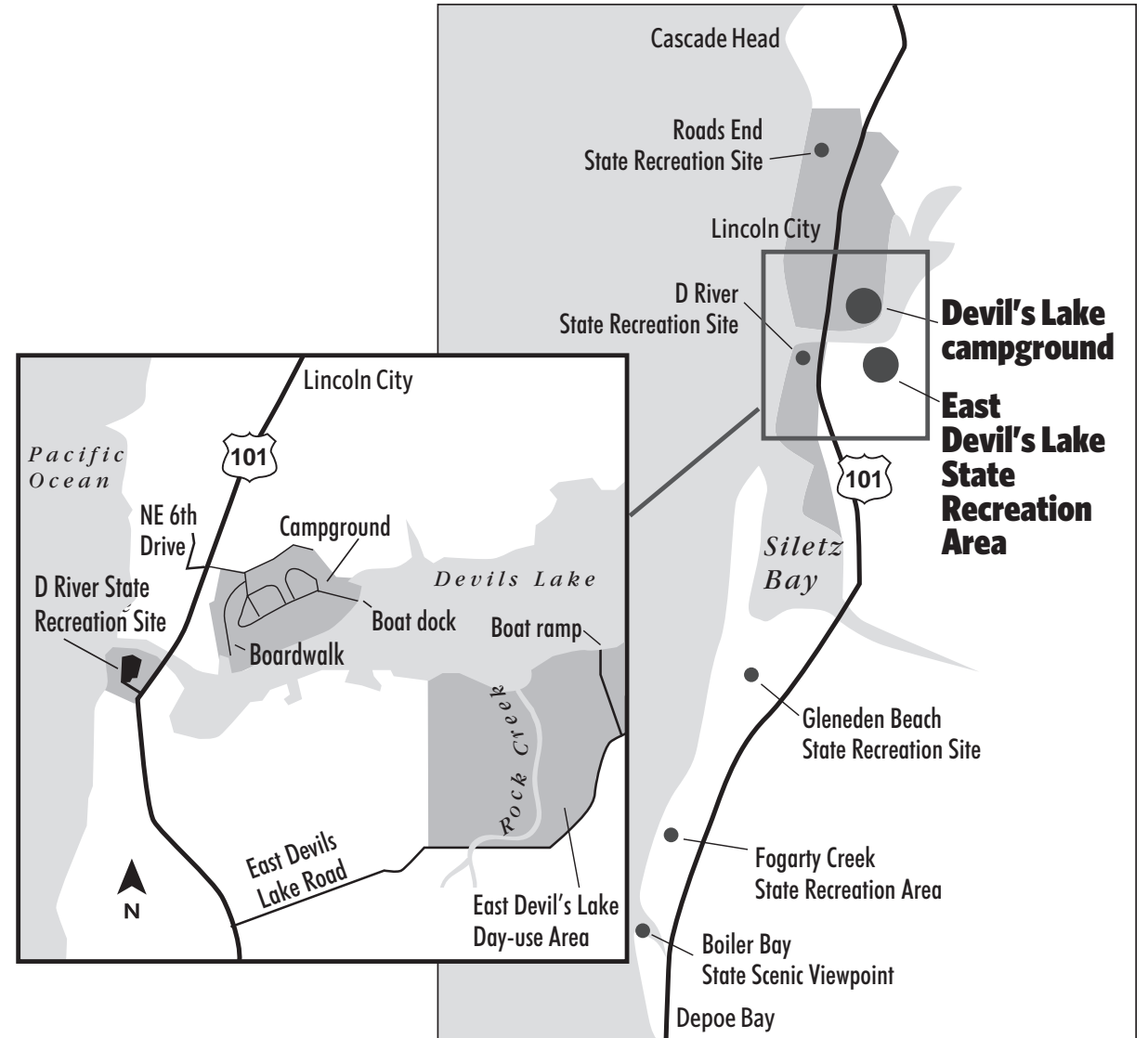
Devils Lake offers a variety of activities including sailing, waterskiing, jet skiing, windsurfing, knee boarding, canoeing, and kayaking. Moorage docks are adjacent to the campground; the day-use area across the lake (off East Devils Lake Road) offers a boat launch and picnic area.

A Choice of Fish

Devils Lake is 22 feet deep at its deepest point, but averages more shallow depths across its 678 acres. The lake abounds with freshwater fish, including rainbow trout, yellow perch, catfish, black crappie, largemouth bass, and bluegill. All can be caught year-round. However, if you happen to catch the lake's most exotic resident, the Chinese Grass Carp (also known as the White Amur), you must release it; this fish was stocked to control vegetation.

Birding Paradise

The wetland at Devils Lake is one of the primary wintering grounds for flocks of migratory geese and ducks. There are also several osprey and bald eagle nests in the vicinity.

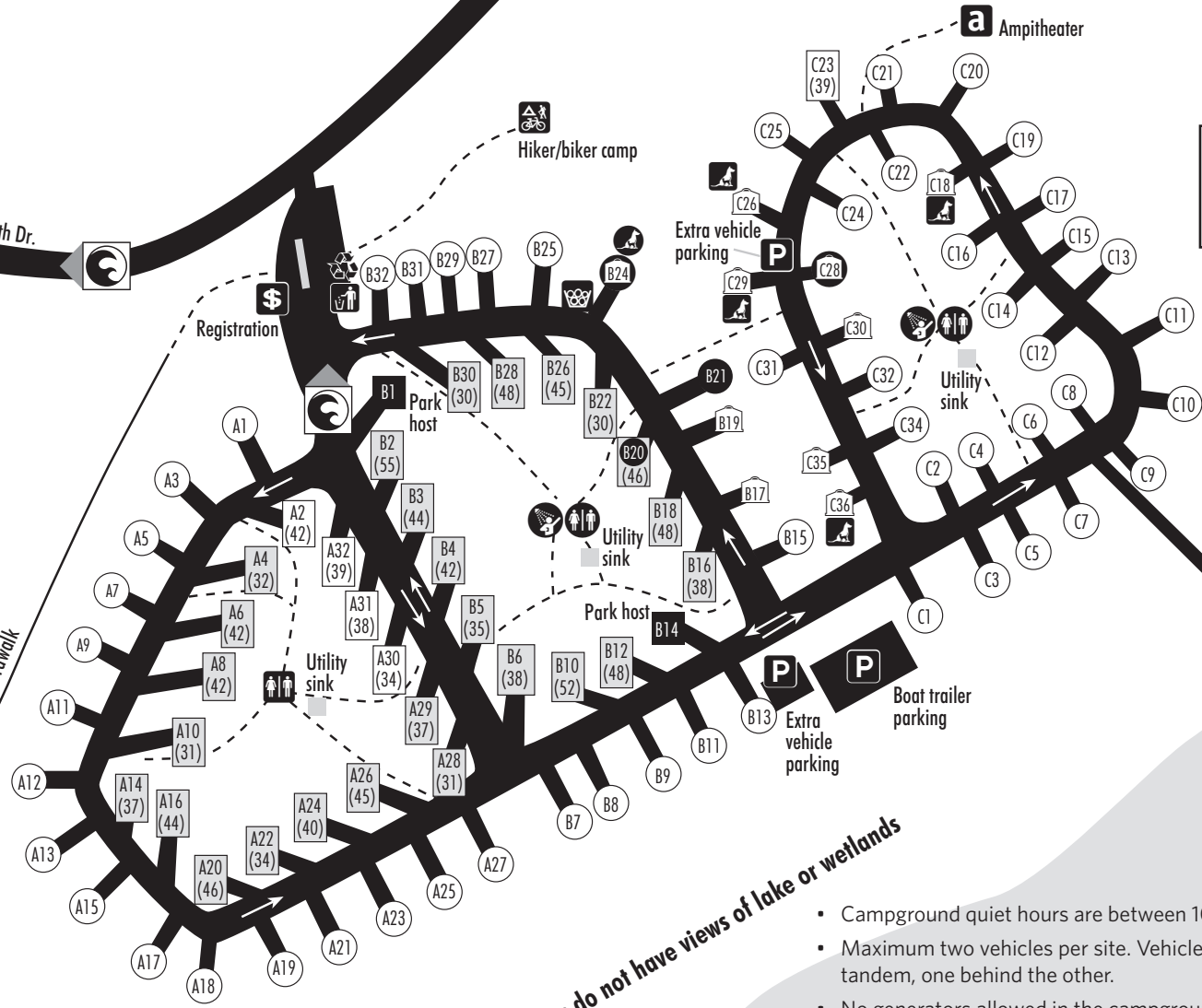

Devils Lake

Sites do not have views of lake or wetlands

Play it safe on the beach!
Stay off logs, know the tide schedule, and don't turn your back on the ocean.

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Maximum two vehicles per site. Vehicles must be parked on pavement and in tandem, one behind the other.
- No generators allowed in the campground.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but must be ridden with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed.
- No camping trailers are permitted in C Loop.

Check-in after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.
