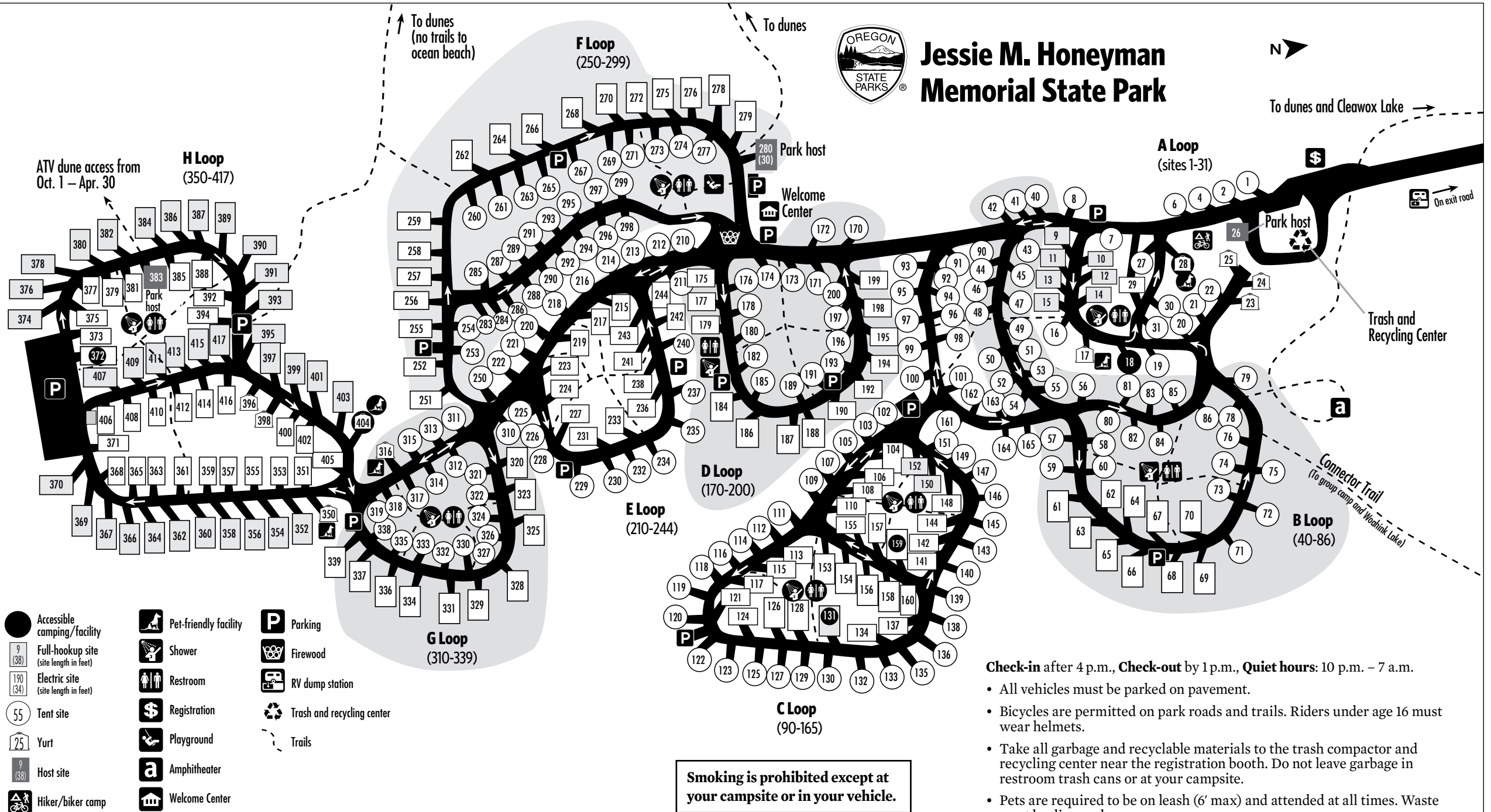




# Jessie M. Honeyman Memorial State Park



**Check-in** after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m., **Quiet hours:** 10 p.m. – 7 a.m.

- All vehicles must be parked on pavement.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads and trails. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Take all garbage and recyclable materials to the trash compactor and recycling center near the registration booth. Do not leave garbage in restroom trash cans or at your campsite.
- Pets are required to be on leash (6' max) and attended at all times. Waste must be disposed.
- **Play it safe on the beach!** Stay off logs, know the tide schedule, and don't turn your back on the ocean.

# Honeyman Campground Guidelines



**ALERT:** Thefts can occur night or day. Secure all gear, coolers, and bicycles.

## Site Payment

Please remember that your campsite payment must be **paid in full within 30 minutes** after arrival. Pay at the registration booth.

## Parking and Extra Vehicles

- All vehicles and trailers (anything with wheels) must be parked on paved areas. Use designated parking areas only.
- All vehicles must display a valid camping receipt or extra vehicle permit.
- Limit of **two** vehicles per site.
- A second vehicle can be accommodated for an additional charge per night. For additional parking, purchase additional campsites.
- Day use permits only valid in day-use areas.

## Pets

Pets must remain on a 6' leash in all state parks and may **never be left unattended**. Please **clean up** after pets; doggie bags are provided for your convenience. Pets are not allowed in facilities unless stated otherwise

## Trash and Recycling Center

Take all garbage and recyclable materials to the trash compactor and recycling center near the registration booth. Do not leave garbage in restroom trash cans or at your campsite.

## Quiet Hours

Quiet hours are 10 p.m. – 7 a.m. and are strictly enforced. Noise producing devices off at 10 p.m. Noise or disruptions, including ATV operation, may be cause for citations and/or eviction from the park.

## ATV USE

### Allowed only in H loop

**All vehicles, including ATVs and trailers, must park only on pavement.**

- Only operate ATVs on roads and in parking areas designated for vehicles in H loop.
- Dune access is for Yurt 316 and H Loop campers **only**. If not camping in H Loop, ATVs must use off-site dune accesses. When not camping in H loop, ATVs must remain loaded. (Exception: When using toy haulers, ATVs may be placed next to a trailer on asphalt but may not be started to do so. This only applies if unloading is required to sleep).
- **Day-use permits do not allow a person dunes access through the park.**
- ATVs are permitted on roadway only to enter and exit dune access in H loop. Riding between sites or on trails to the restroom is not permitted.
- Stop at all STOP signs, including the dune exit gate. Observe all posted speed limits in the campground and on the access road.
- ATV maintenance involving the changing or draining of fluids is prohibited.

### Age Requirement

All operators of quads or off-road motorcycles must have an ATV Safety Education Card. Youth under age 16 must be supervised and properly fit the vehicle they are operating. Riders under age 18 must wear a fastened, DOT-approved helmet unless riding in a street-legal vehicle.

### Noise Control Regulations

To minimize conflicts between ATV users and other campers or residents in the vicinity, the maximum noise emission level is enforced in the campground and on the Dunes National Recreation Area.

**U.S. Forest Service Rules** apply when you exit and enter the dunes from Honeyman. Know and follow the rules.
