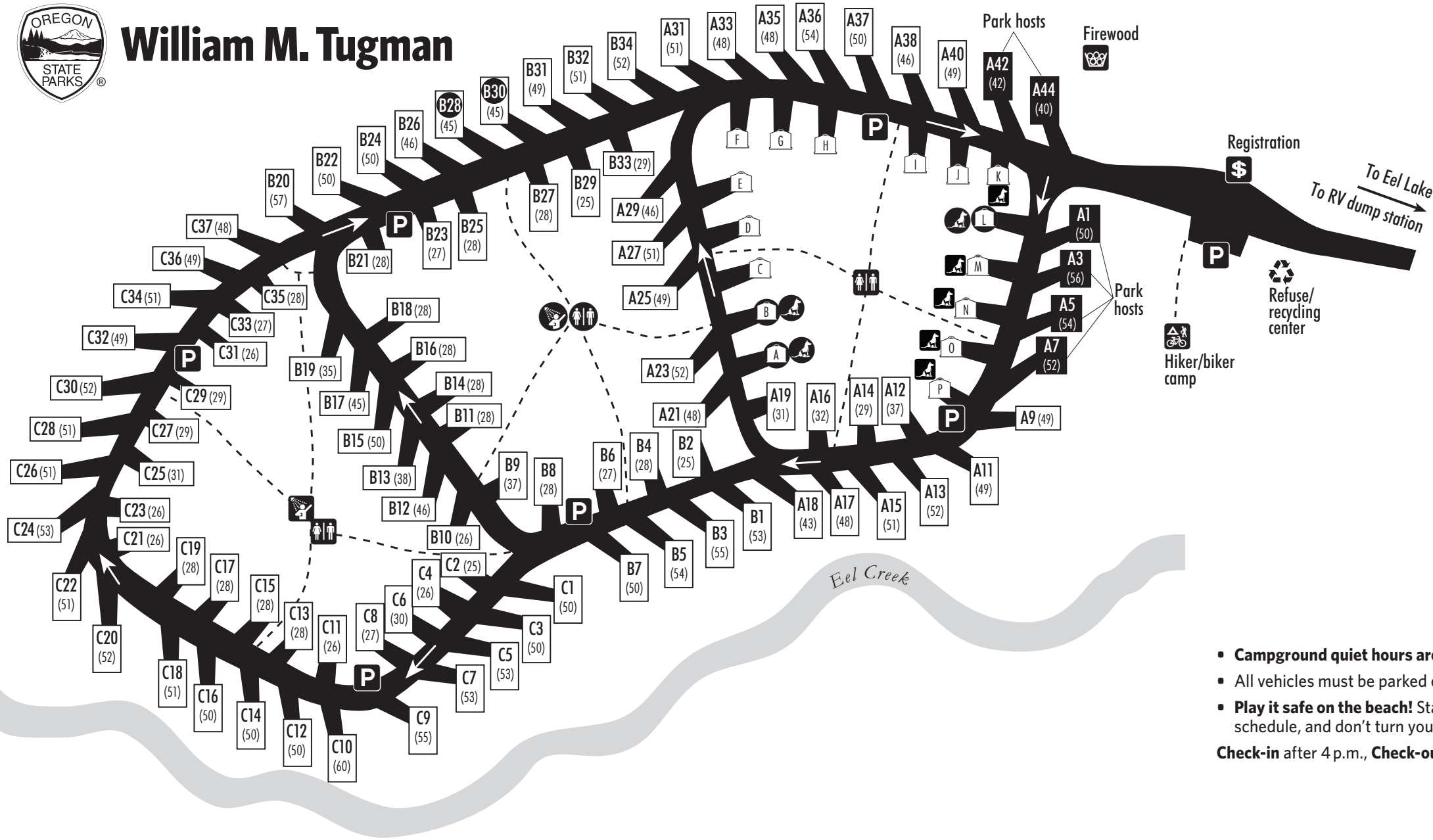

- Check-in** after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.

William M. Tugman Campground Guidelines



PLEASE NOTE: Thefts can occur night or day. Secure your vehicle and your gear, coolers and gas cans.

VEHICLES

- All vehicles and trailers (anything with wheels) must be parked on asphalt and display a valid camping receipt.
- Limit two motorized vehicles per site, one of which can be a sleeping vehicle or a unit such as a camper or motor home.
- A second vehicle can be accommodated for an extra charge per night.
- All ATVs must remain parked on trailers or in the back of pickups. The only exception is for toy haulers: ATVs may be parked next to them on the asphalt.
- **Do not start ATVs while in the campground.**

QUIET HOURS

Quiet hours are 10 p.m. – 7 a.m. and are strictly enforced. Music must be turned off by 10 p.m. Noise disruptions may be cause for citations and/or eviction from the park.

PETS

Keep dogs on a leash (maximum length 6 feet). **Please clean up** after your dog and **never** leave it unattended. Doggie bags are provided for your convenience. Pets are not allowed in restrooms. Do not leave pets unattended. The off-leash exercise area is located on the west side of the day-use road and parking lot.

TRASH AND RECYCLING

The waste and recycling center is next to the registration booth. Bathroom receptacles are for bathroom waste only. Please do not leave garbage behind at your campsite.

PAYMENT

Site and vehicle fees are due within 30 minutes of arrival. Pay at the registration station at the park entrance.

FOOD

Please make sure your food is stowed in a secure container. Squirrels, racoons and crows can tear through food and garbage bags.

FIREWOOD

Purchase firewood from park hosts at the entrance to the campground. Please don't collect branches or cut living plants! Help preserve nature in your state parks.

BICYCLISTS AND SKATERS

Wear a helmet: it's Oregon law for anyone younger than 16.

Follow safety rules: Obey all signs, ride on the right, and take it slow. Motorized scooters are not permitted.

SMOKING POLICY

Smoking in Oregon State Parks is allowed only in personal vehicles, RVs and campsites.

Please report any problems to park staff at the registration station near the park entrance.

After hours, contact the park hosts at the entrance to the campground.
