Umpqua Lighthouse State Park offers year-round camping, a scenic freshwater lake, and a setting amidst the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area.

Year-Round Camping

- 12 full hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water)
- Eight electrical sites with water
- 23 tent sites with water nearby
- Two rustic yurts (one pet friendly)
- Six deluxe yurts (two pet friendly)
- Two rustic log cabins (one pet friendly)
- Hiker/biker camp
- Paved parking, picnic table, and fire rings at all sites
- Hot showers and flush toilets

Universal Access

One deluxe yurt (#16) is accessible to campers with disabilities.

Yurts!

A yurt is a domed tent with structural support, a wood floor, and a lockable wooden door. It has lights, heating, and beds with vinyl-covered mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three and a futon couch sleeps two. A fire ring, picnic table, and paved parking are right outside.

Deluxe Yurts

Umpqua Lighthouse is the only Oregon state park with deluxe yurts. They have a kitchen with refrigerator, microwave, and sink, as well as a full bathroom with shower. A TV/DVD player is also provided (no cable available). The 24-foot diameter facility can sleep seven people. Up to two pets (cats and or/dogs only) are allowed in pet-friendly yurts for an additional fee.

Cabins

These one-room rustic cabins sleep four people and have heat, lights, and a table with chairs. The decks overlook Lake Marie.

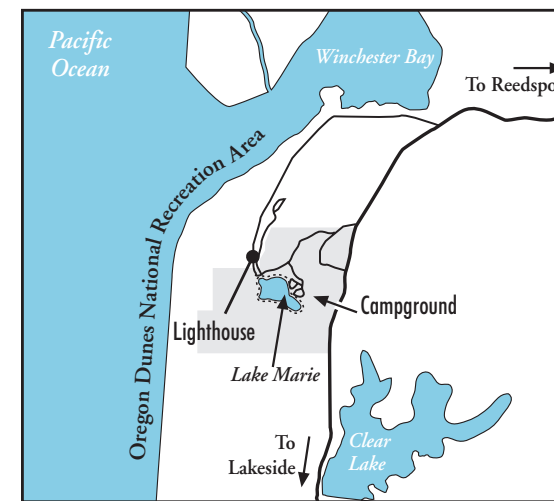
Lake Marie

Both the campground and day-use areas lie next to Lake Marie, a small but picturesque body of water bounded by the dunes. The lake is open to canoeing and fishing. A small, sandy beach accommodates swimmers. A one-mile, self-guided nature trail circles the lake.

Dunes North, Dunes South

The park is located in the center of the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area, which stretches 47 miles from Florence to Coos Bay. While famous for OHV riding opportunities, the dunes also offer many activities for those who are not OHV enthusiasts. Enjoy hiking, paddling, wildlife viewing, picnicking, sand play and beach access. Dune buggy rentals are available in nearby Reedsport or Winchester Bay. The Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area information center is in Reedsport.

Smoking in Oregon State Parks is allowed only in personal vehicles, RVs, campsites and portions of day use parks along state highways that are designated as safety rest areas by the Oregon Department of Transportation.

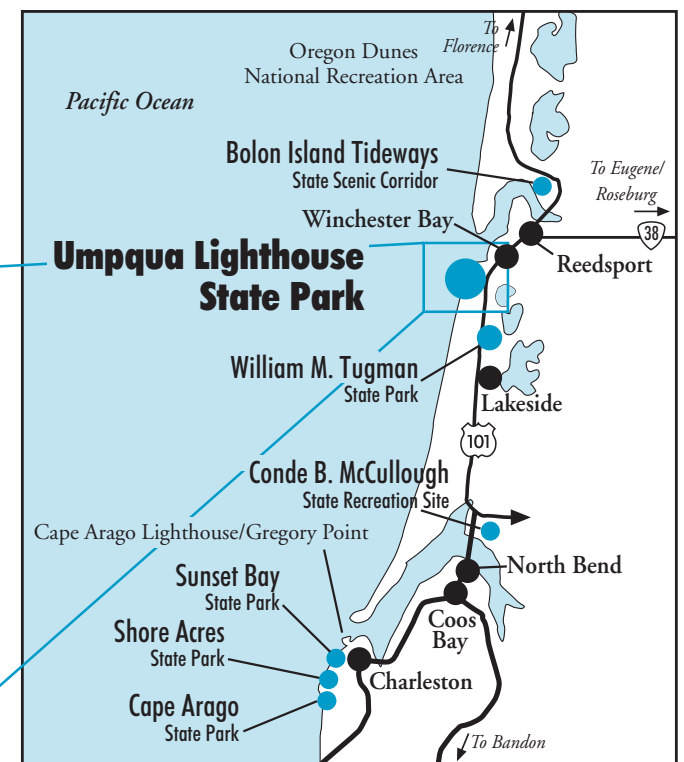
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Umpqua River Lighthouse

The first lighthouse on the Oregon coast was built on the north spit of the Umpqua River in 1857. However, it was destroyed just four years later by a severe storm.

Today's lighthouse has a 65-foot tower and sits on a hill 100 feet above sea level on the south side of Winchester Bay. Its lens emits distinctive red and white automated flashes, the only colored signal on the Oregon Coast.

The lighthouse is maintained by the Douglas County Parks and Recreation Department, which offers tours May through October. Call (541) 271-4631 for current schedules and information.

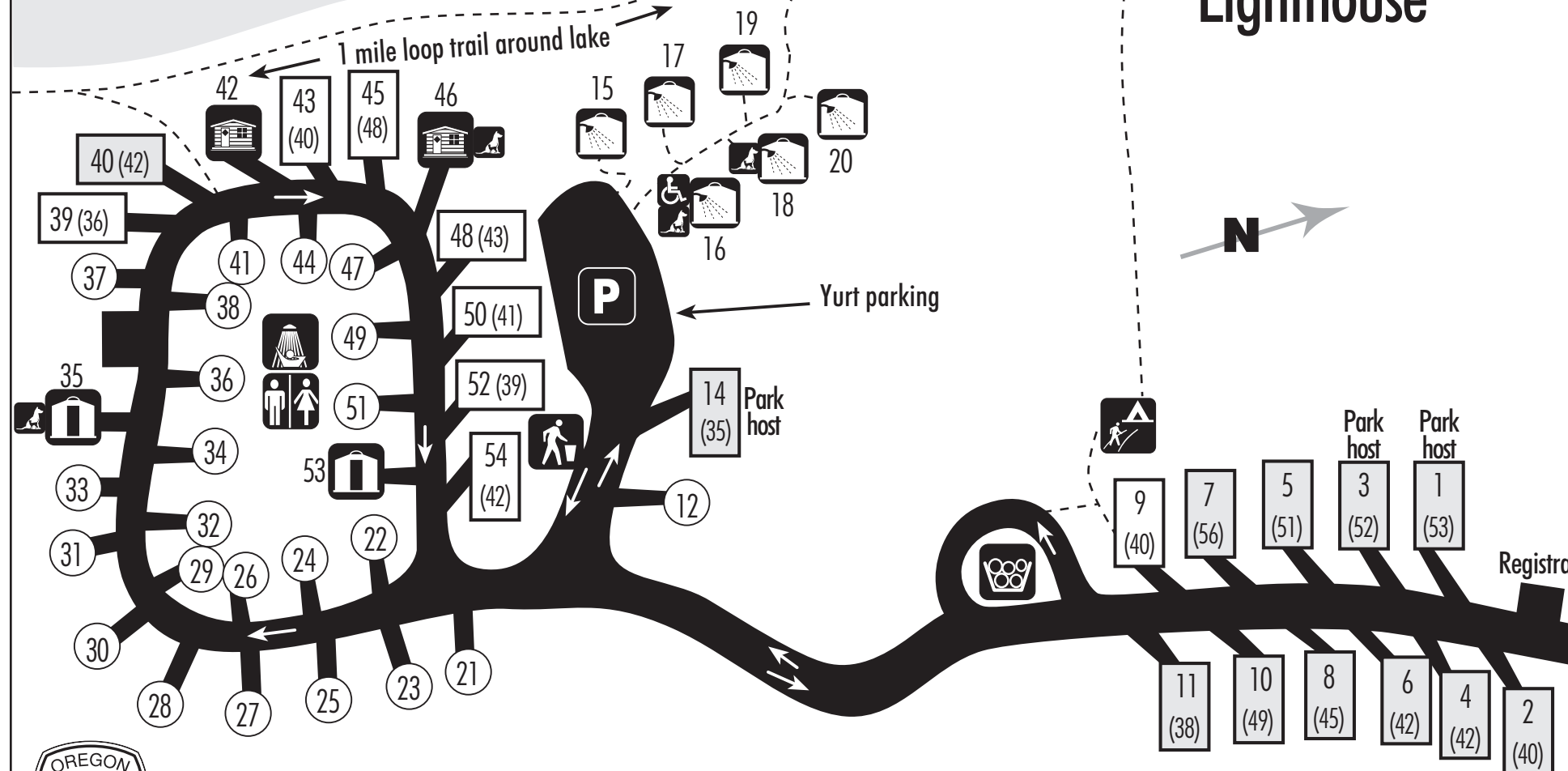

Please help make camping at Umpqua Lighthouse a safe and enjoyable experience by following these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- All vehicles must be parked on pavement.
- Bicycles and skateboards are permitted on park roads, but must be ridden with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Please take all garbage to the waste station located across from site #12. Do not leave garbage in restroom trash cans or at your campsite.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. Pets must not be left unattended. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)
- **An RV dump station is located at William Tugman State Park, about 5.5 miles to the south on US 101.**

Check-in after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.
